The imagery of this hymn, Jesus being the Lord of our dance, has always been quite meaningful to me. It is inspiring and passionate and evokes much joy, describing the life of Christ as a beautiful, though sometimes heartbreaking, dance. The conclusion, of course, is the joyous dance of Resurrection, which affirms the promise of new and everlasting life.

As we turn the corner in Lent and head gratefully into the Easter season, recounting the life of Christ in its entirety helps us value the "long view" that God's perspective provides. Wherever we are, whatever we are dealing with, Jesus is leading us in the "dance" to which we have been called.
