

Transition students will explore job opportunities and career options including a variety of trades, technology fields, and higher education tracks. Students will have access to dual enrollment classes at Lake Sumter State College and Lake Technical College, while maintaining the support and structure of classroom learning. Transition students will also have access to a variety of supplementary programs like Driver's Ed, Vocational Rehab, and Florida's Work Ready programs. The goal of this program is to explore interests, build skills, increase employability, and enable independent learning beyond the High School setting.

DAVIDIC DANCE

In the Bible, Psalm 149:3 says, "Let them praise his name with dancing."



We are very blessed with an opportunity to learn Davidic dance from Ralph and Dr. Mindy Fisher Seta this August 8th! Registration and fellowship from 5-6 p.m. and dance from 6-9 p.m. Their current tour includes California, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Florida, Switzerland, and concludes with a return to Israel for Sukkot, the Feast of Tabernacles. They are known world-wide for their dance instruction and leadership in dance ministry.

What is Davidic dance? This is a type of dance also called, "Messianic dance" and is a joyful expression of praise and thanksgiving to God. It is danced to Israeli music and has been danced for thousands of years.

Why should I come to this? This is an opportunity for us to gather as a community and experience an evening of dancing the way that King David and his lineage danced. You do not need to know anything to participate. You will experience an evening of community, joy, and worship.

What should I wear? Be in comfortable clothes that you can move around in. Wear tennis shoes or flats.

Can I come to just watch? Of course you can! (We would ask you still donate \$10 to support the ministry.) You can be a part of the community in the way that works for you physically! We would love people sitting around the circle clapping along with us and *praising God*!

What does it cost? There is a suggested donation of \$10 per person with a cap of \$20 per family! They are trusting in God to cover their travel expenses. They have shared that it will cost \$400 to cover their cost while here in Leesburg, Florida. Every year St. James participates in the Jamaica Medical Mission. This is a national Ministry that brings hope to communities across Jamaica by sharing supplies, skills and medical expertise to individuals that might not otherwise have easy access to such needed resources.

Several volunteers from St. James travel to Jamacia each year to take part in this ministry and the Taste of St James is a Fundraiser for supplies and medical needs to benefit the Jamaica Medical Mission.

We need 20 CHEFS to prepare enough food for 100 people to taste. The food items needs to be ONE ITEM only, (2–4 OUNCES, A SAMPLING). This can be anything from a chocolate desert to a delicious steak hors d'oeuvre, we encourage creativity.

THE BOOK OF REVELATION

Bible Study with Jeff Brooke-Stewart

Beginning on September 4th at 6:30 p.m., we will begin a Fall/Winter evening Bible study in the Parish Hall.

Let me say that "I have been persuaded" to lead the group through the final book in our scriptures - The Revelation to John, or simply; Revelations. I did lead a group through Revelations quite some years ago here at St James, and many members asked for this study again.

Revelations is arguably the most complex book in scripture. But in its complexity it also has much beauty. Over time it has received many interpretations, understandings and has led to various prophetic thoughts. It has inspired poets and authors. MacLean Gilmour described it as "a drama of a high order set on a cosmic stage". It undoubtedly was the model for C S Lewis' novel "The Last Battle".

Revelations contains timeless practical advice to the church and it builds to a wonderful affirmation of Christ. There is of course, the introduction of seemingly complex apocalyptic references to dragons and beasts and stars falling to earth, (just imagine that for a moment!), but with careful reading and discussion they need not confuse us, but rather help our understanding.

I use the English Standard Version (ESV) Bible. I recommend a very inexpensive (\$4.00 as I recall) little book from Amazon entitled "ESV Scripture Journal: Revelation". Opposite each page of scripture is a lined blank page for your notes. Very helpful.
