MUSIC MUSINGS February 2021

"And God will raise you up on eagle's wings, bear you on the breath of dawn, make you to shine like the sun, and hold you in the palm of His hand..."

It was a less than stellar instrument residing in an incredibly noble place. Dusty and not in tune, some of the black keys on this piano's treble end were sheared off and at the same height as the adjacent white keys. If you are a pianist you know this provides quite a challenge; the height and grouping variations of the black keys allow one's fingers to more easily find and play correct keys without always looking. Add to this the fact the piece I had to play was in the key of G flat, hence my fingers had to quickly find the necessary black keys and play them at appropriate times. Sigh...

I hadn't thought of this experience in over 40 years until this week, the first week in January, 2021. January 6, to be exact. For this happened to me in our nation's Capitol Rotunda, the scene of this week's horrific events.

In 1977, I accompanied a group of singers from my college to Washington D.C., where we were privileged to sing in the White House, as well as in the Rotunda. When we arrived at the Rotunda, someone scrambled to find a piano, and what appeared was what I described above. A flawed instrument, with several broken parts, very difficult to play. It sat in stark contrast to the glorious heritage of the rotunda. But you know what I remember most about that day? I remember playing to the best of my ability, and then hearing the stunning voices lifting up to the rotunda, resonating like the voices of angels. In spite of the flaws and brokenness of the piano, we kept going, hoping for (and hearing) a better outcome than expected or deserved.

And that's what we must do now...My heart is broken for what happened in our nation's capital, for the anger and resentment that overflowed there, the flaws and brokenness that erupted into expressions of hate and violence. As we stumble through these difficult times nationally, my friends, my prayer is that we can rise above our own brokenness to a place where God can hold us in the palm of his hand, tenderly allowing us to heal and move forward with grace and peace for all.
