Lent begins this year on ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 14th,

With the Imposition of Ashes at 8:00 a.m., 12:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.

The 6:00 PM service will include Holy Eucharist, with music and hymns

On the First Sunday in Lent, February 18th, we will read The Great Litany. This rite of penitence goes back to the first Book of Common Prayer in 1549. Deacon Art Hollows will deliver the sermon.

On the Second Sunday in Lent, February 25th, the sermon will be delivered by Sebastiana Springmann, who is a Postulant for Holy Orders at St. James.

Our Sunday Eucharists in Lent will be Rite I at both 8:00 and 10:15 AM. Rite I utilizes classical Anglican language, and focuses more deeply on the theology of Christ's atonement.

We encourage each of you to make a Lenten commitment to attend church, if possible, every Sunday, and take part in at least one opportunity for learning, fellowship and discipleship:

LIBRARY CORNER

You have probably checked your calendar already to affirm the beginning of the season of Lent this year, and realize that Lent begins on Feb. 14th, Valentine's Day.

This doubling up of special days could present a challenge to both celebrating by giving or receiving loving presents, such as a box of chocolates, to honor St. Valentine and a loved one, to a decision to give up chocolate as you follow your way of honoring your chosen Lenten rules of denial. How could we deal with this conundrum? Choose a HEART as an acronym of the Christian Lenten season, and for each letter of HEART devise a method for your preparations for Easter during the 40 days of Lent:

H (eart) - Help out around the house.

- E Eliminate one thing that keeps you from having God as the center of your life, (such as a video game, junk food or complaining).
- A Add one thing to your life that puts God in your life, like regular church attendance.
- R Relationship,, spend time with someone alone or lonely, such as a resident of a nursing home or a grand parent.
- T- Talk to God in prayer; start and end your day with prayer and ask for His blessing. Following the HEART method, you would be celebrating LOVE and keeping it going. Our Christian faith is about LOVE for one another, and the literal symbol HEART represents that LOVE. Have a prayerful Lent and a Happy Valentine's Day.
