Since the "Taste of St. James" last September we have been very busy acquiring our supplies for the mission in February 2024. We want to thank you again very much for your donations and your support of the mission to enable us to do this.

So far, we have 30 + boxes packed up and inventoried of the specific over-the-counter medicines and supplies that we need to run the week-long mission at St. Marys' in Port Maria, Jamaica.

In the past we have done things differently and asked for supplies, but we have found this to be difficult and very time consuming as for entering each item for inventory. It is also not cost effective for shipping. This year we have purchased our needs through only a few stores where the items are the same brand and the expiration date the same.

Some of you have inquired as to how you can help. We're glad you asked. Gift Cards to Sams, Walmart, Dollar Tree and Amazon will be much needed in the future. As we prepare for the 2024 Mission, so far, we have approximately 50 volunteers ready to attend in February. January 2024 we will drive our supplies to Miami where they will be put on a boat and shipped to Kingston and then they will be retrieved and taken to St. Marys' in Port Maria.
