

ST. NICHOLAS HOUSE PROGRESS REPORT **David Knowles**

The St. Nicholas House was built as a parsonage about 60 years ago. It served that purpose for almost 5 decades. Currently it is used mostly for storage and youth activities. It is in need of some TLC and a rededication. A building committee was formed with five members: Junior Warden Drew Logan, Vestry Members Marc Crouch, David Knowles, Linda Weekly, and Contractor John O'Kelly. Michael O'Kelly, architect, was a former acolyte at St. James, and has also been most helpful is our efforts.

Our plan included improvements that go from flooring to roof. Also, our plan changes the use of the building from a house with many bedrooms and interesting small spaces to an OPEN CONCEPT nursery, youth, teen center. We identified seven areas that need special attention: the roof, skylights, office, porch, kitchen, deck, and bathrooms. I deliberately leave out some of the details to keep this report to one page. We developed a rough cost to make these changes at \$165,000. This is a large number, but the replacement cost of St. Nicholas house could be \$350K-\$400K. The Vestry approved our plan and the finance committee found appropriate funding.

To begin our total renovation, the first step was to clear out the real treasures that have accumulated over the years. We are going to move some storage to different parts of the church to better utilize what space we have now. A pod is also available for some items. ECW has had a spring sale and cleared much of their inventory. When we complete the plan ECW will be permanently moved to classroom #2 where a portion of the nursery is located now. It is closer to Jodie's Gift Shop. Classroom #8, the acolyte room, will move to classroom #3 the other portion of the nursery. The Jamaica Mission will have a home in classroom #8. The youth items are still being boxed and moved to the pod. When complete, the kids and the nursery will move back to St. Nicholas house where they will have bathrooms and an updated kitchen. We suspect that opening up the interior with new flooring and a little paint will make this area very attractive to our youth.

The building committee has met many times in the last three months to finalize our design, but we want to proceed carefully. Some repairs have already been made on the southwest corner of the building which needed repair badly. Overall, the "bones" of the building appear good and we optimistically hope to move all the equipment out of the pod and back into St. Nicholas house by this fall. Anyone who would like to move boxes or remove walls, your help is invited and appreciated.
