ALPHA is an opportunity to grapple with the bigger questions of life and faith - in a fun, nonthreatening, nonjudgmental online environment. It is an opportunity to share virtual fellowship with other people who are traveling on the same path. It is a great way to explore Christianity. It is for anyone who wants to feel more connected in this challenging time.

Some things to know about our Alpha Online program:

There will be 12 weekly meetings starting Wednesday, March 10. Each session starts at 6:30 pm and lasts no more than 75 minutes.

After a brief welcome, there will be a 30-minute video that explores the basics of Christianity.

This will be followed by wonderful small-group discussion where you get to participate in your own way - to share or just listen. A virtual retreat will be held in mid-April (more info to come!)

Are you interested in joining? Want to give the first session a try to see if you like it? Each session includes a short video and then some discussion time all via ZOOM. If you haven't done a ZOOM meeting, we will be giving a short training session beforehand to get you started. You can do it on a tablet, a computer, or your phone.
