

"Do not be afraid, I am with you. I have called you each by name. Come and follow me, I will bring you home... I love you and you are mine."

The value of being loved, called, and valued...immeasurable. That is the gift that God gives us each and every day. The text of this anthem by David Haas reminds us that we are not alone, that we are known and called by God for purposes that are often beyond our understanding.

I have frequently laughed at the situations into which God has placed me, situations that challenge my comfort, require me to step out (in faith?) into a new reality. I remember being in Junior High School (that's what they used to call it "back in the day") and my friends wanted me to play the piano in our school's talent show. Though I had played for many years by then, I was terrified. Very much an introvert, I didn't do solo work; I played well enough to accompany for my band friends at their solo and ensemble contests, but the thought of playing by myself in front of actual people was more than I could bear. My friends wouldn't take no for an answer, however, so I reluctantly agreed to play...as long as they let me play behind the stage curtain. Which they did. Until halfway through the piece, at which point they opened the curtain so I could be both seen and heard. And you know what? I survived.

God calls and equips, in spite of our frailties, in spite of our fears. This has been a lesson that I continue to learn, but I am blessed to truly believe that I, that you, are loved and called by God. Embrace God's call, dear ones, and press on!
