




PRAYERS FOR BILL BREWER

"May the words of my mouth and the meditations of my heart

Be acceptable in Thy sight, O Lord.

I am also struggling with how and what to pray during this season, but have heard it said that praying the Psalms is good spiritual discipline. I am going to begin doing this as a matter of course, because I do believe that even when I don't have the words, God hears the meditations of my heart and will give strength for each new day.

Praying with you, and waiting on the comfort that only God can provide!
