October

"In the bulb there is a flower, in the seed an apple tree, in cocoons a hidden promise: butterflies will soon be free. In the cold and snow of winter there's a spring that waits to be. Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see." (Hymn of Promise, Natalie Sleeth, 1986)

And then there were chives! But I digress...first, the backstory:

Paul and I have found that we enjoy cooking together. And by that I mean I read the recipe out loud, chop a few vegetables, and he does the heavy lifting. It's really fun, at least for me! Recently Paul became interested in one of the Barefoot Contessa's new cookbooks, so he bought it and we have been trying some new dishes. One sounded particularly good so we decided we would tackle it, but first we'd go to Whole Foods where we knew there'd be a better chance of finding the exact ingredients she called for, and,

therefore, we'd end up with a better rendition of the recipe. Several paychecks later we came home with what we needed to try not one, but two new recipes. In an effort to save a few pennies we decided we'd buy chives in plant form, because, of course, every penny counts. When it came time for me to chop the chives, I took my scissors and cut them within a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch of the dirt, then chopped them for the dish, having barely enough for the recipe. The chive plant was at this point a pitiful specimen of its former self. We chalked it up to lesson learned, and didn't think about it again...until we walked outside a couple of days later and noticed that the chive plant was now at least three inches tall and looking healthier than ever! And a few days after that it was even taller, begging to be trimmed for our next culinary adventure.

Now my green thumb friends are probably thinking, "well, of course; this is how things grow," but I've never been much of a gardener, so this was a revelation to me. And, I'm thinking, the lesson here has far more to do with life, than with gardening. When all seems lost, when nothing seems as if it will be ever be right again, a new day dawns and you find that your chives have grown at least three inches...
